At St. Francis of Assisi we follow the Life Teen program to provide relevant and dynamic faith formation for teens. This ministry uses various teams/roles which, together, make one incredible family. Below are all of the different teams within Life Teen that are available to be a part of. Please read over all of the descriptions and mark which teams you would be most interested in being on:

___Core Team: This is the most active team. Core members are active participants at Life Nights, lead small groups, help organize and plan events and overall have the most interaction with the teens. Core members should be upstanding role models of faith to the youth (goes to mass weekly and reconciliation regularly, is in good standing with the Catholic Church and agrees with and lives by the Church's teachings on moral topics).

___Discipleship Team: Each month the teens will meet in *discipleship small groups* instead of a Life Night. Volunteers on this team lead these groups once a month through specific studies relating to the grade level of the group. The discipleship groups consist of two adult leaders of the same gender and varying number of teens of the same age and gender.

___Environment Team: Volunteers on this team will be in charge of setting up the environments for each Life Night and retreat. This can include making or building items that will be used to "set the scene" by being relevant to the teaching at the time. Guidelines and suggestions will be provided by the youth minister. Anyone who is artistically or creatively gifted or who has any handy skills would be a great addition to this team.

__Cook Team: Teens are always hungry, which makes this an important team for Life Teen. Everyone on this team will work together to prepare and serve dinner at every gathering (Life Nights and Family Nights). After meals, this team will also be in charge of clean up.
